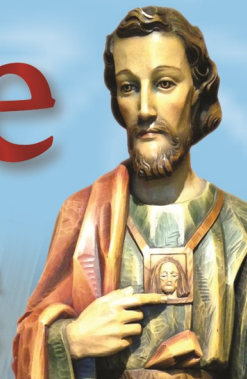


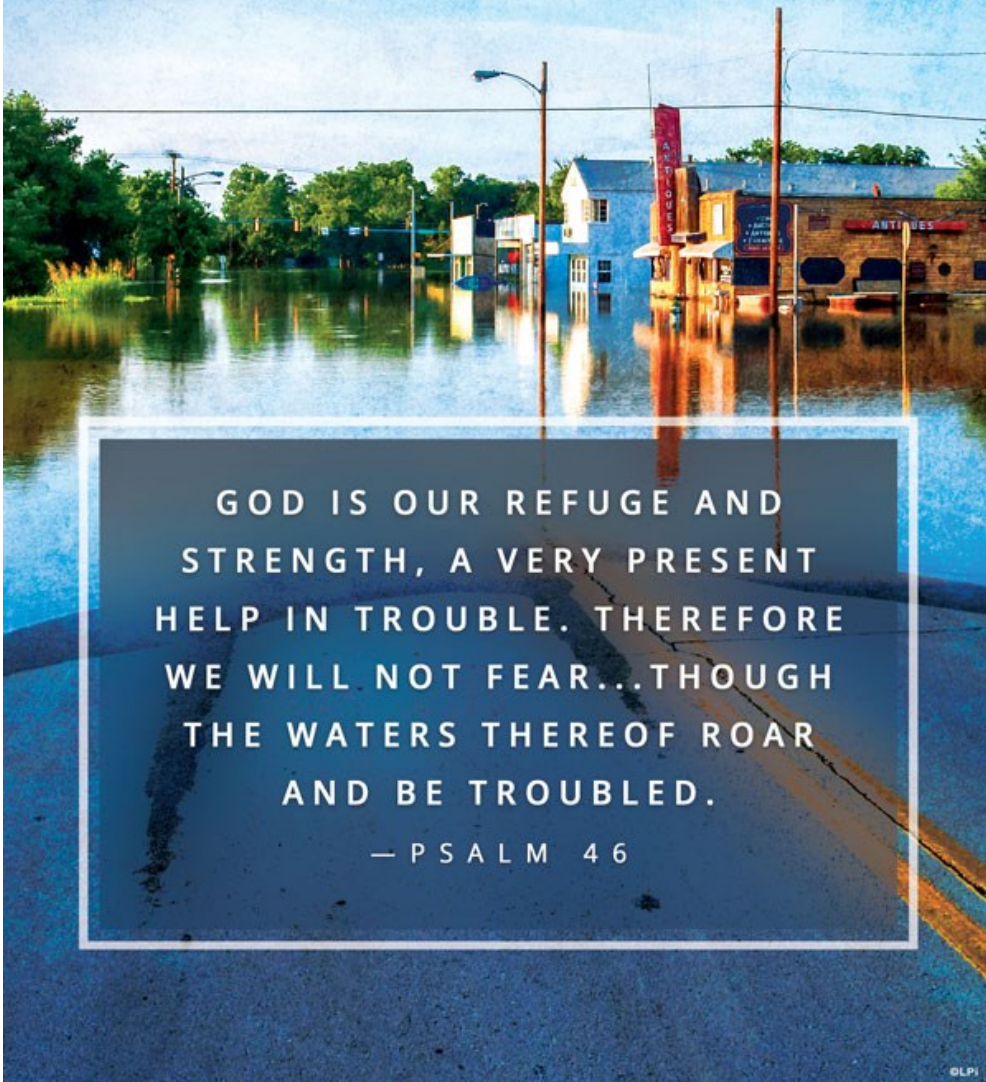

### Confessions

Saturday - 3:30 to 4:15 p.m. 20 minutes before weekday Mass or anytime by appointment.

### Baptisms

You must take the Baptismal preparation class prior to the baptism of your first baby. Baptisms normally held after one of the weekend Masses.

### Marriages

Please consult Father at least nine months before any date being considered for the wedding ceremony.

### Communion to the Sick

Please notify Father. Communion usually taken on Second Friday a.m. and on Sundays after 8:30 a.m. Mass.

### Anointing of the Sick

Please notify Father if there is serious illness or danger of death or if surgery is planned so that you may receive beforehand the anointing and prayer for healing and strength.

Grandparents Day is celebrated by many Americans in September. Promoted by Marian McQuade of West Virginia in the 1970s, a bill was finally signed into law by President Jimmy Carter in 1979 designating the Sunday after Labor Day as National Grandparents Day. Mrs. McQuade's work with seniors made her particularly attentive to shut-ins and other elderly not fortunate enough to have family members close by. She viewed National Grandparents Day as an opportunity for children to adopt a grandparent and so provide some friendship to those who might now be alone in their later years.



Three months after the Sept. 11, 2001, attack on the United States, President George W. Bush signed into law a bill designating Sept. 11 as Patriot Day. Not to be confused with Patriots' Day, an April holiday in some New England states celebrating the first shots fired at Lexington and Concord, Patriot Day honors the nearly three thousand people who lost their lives on the morning of Sept. 11, 2001. Flags are flown at half-staff throughout the country, and a moment of silence is observed at 8:46am Eastern time, the minute the first plane struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York. While Memorial Day and similar state observances honor those who have given their lives in service to their country, Patriot Day is unique in that it honors first responders as well as the many civilians who died that day.

*Prayer for Peace--I think we all remember where we were on 9/11. We saw the tower fall and we saw the selfless first responders run toward the falling towers and debris without concern for their well-being, but for that of the fallen men and women. This is the model of patriotism, and why we now celebrate Patriot Day. Let us pray... O God of selfless love, we are a blest people to have a god like you. You instill your love for us into the hearts of your human creatures. Even if those human creatures do not acknowledge you, your love for us still shines through. We ask your blessing upon all first responders today and ask you to protect them and their families. Help us love people of all nations, races, and creeds, which will bring about the end of wars and terrorism. We ask all this in your peace. Amen*
